Starting with Pride

Why start with pride when examining sin? C.S Lewis wrote that pride is the great sin. He said that “If I am a proud man, then as long as there is one man in the whole world more powerful, or richer, or more clever than I, he is my rival and my enemy.”

Webster’s Definition of Pride: the quality or state of being proud: such as. a : inordinate self-esteem : conceit. b : a reasonable or justifiable self-respect. c : delight or elation arising from some act, possession, or relationship parental pride.

Scriptures are clear regarding God’s position on pride and the results of unchecked pride:

- “Everyone who is proud in heart is an abomination to the LORD; assuredly, he will not be unpunished.” Proverbs 16:5
- “God is opposed to the proud, but give grace to the humble.” James 4:6
Isaiah 2:11

Prescription for combating Pride

1. Admit that it could be you.
2. Pray
 - Christ informs us in the Lords Prayer, “Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.”
 - Christ prayed to the Father in the Garden of Gethsemane. “Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done.” Luke 22:42

3. Pursue Humility

- “Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you at the proper time...” 1 Peter 4:14
- “For My hand made all these things, thus all these things came into being,” declares the LORD. “But to this one I will look, to him who is humble and contrite of spirit, and who trembles at My word.” Isaiah 66:2
- Apostle Paul said that even he was given a thorn in his side to prevent his possible pride
 - “Because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me—to keep me from exalting myself!” 2 Corinthians 12:7
 - What “thorns” might be present in your life?
